<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Slipping / tripping • Deep water • Contact with animal faeces • Insect stings / bites • Poor weather conditions • Deep, untreated water • Dipping platform – slippery • Brambles / nettles / branches • Long handled dipping net (could poke/hit someone) • Allergies to water, creatures 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Young people • Braeside staff • Visiting staff • Volunteers 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Clear briefing to whole group of potential dangers and boundaries • Work in groups of less than 10 • Cover cuts with appropriate dressings • No climbing or sticks allowed • Carry a throw line when around deep water • Appropriate hand washing • Strict control of numbers on and off dipping platform • Regular checks of platform condition • Throw line to be kept on platform • Gate kept locked when not in use • When minibeasts hunting use spoons to pick up creatures • Careful instruction of pooters and which straw to suck! • Gather allergy information before visit – school to administer / carry medications.
