Spread of Virus through contact with surfaces	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Staff Visitors to premises Cleaners Contractors Vulnerable groups – Elderly, Pregnant workers, those with existing underlying health conditions Anyone else who physically comes in contact with you in relation to your business 	H	<p>Hand Washing</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Hand washing facilities with soap and water in place. Stringent hand washing taking place. Drying of hands with disposable paper towels. - HAND DRYERS SHOULD NOT BE USED Gel sanitisers should be readily available, in any area where washing facilities are not available + at entrance to any communal areas <p>Cleaning</p> <p>Frequently cleaning and disinfecting objects and surfaces that are touched regularly particularly in areas of high use such as door handles, light switches, reception areas using appropriate cleaning products and methods. For outdoor or indoor activity hardware equipment the surfaces that can be disinfected will be or quarantined for 72 hours. For activity equipment worn by participants the equipment will be disinfected or quarantined for a 72 hr period. A cleaning schedule to ensure it is completed correctly.</p> <p>Wearing of Gloves</p> <p>Where Risk Assessment identifies wearing of gloves as a requirement of the job, an adequate supply of these will be provided. Staff will be instructed on how to remove gloves carefully to reduce contamination and how to dispose of them safely. Small groups created to minimise contact with others.</p> <p>Staff shift patterns changed, working from home where possible is encouraged. Contractors only allowed onsite when groups are not present. Also relocating workers to other tasks.</p> <p>Redesigning any processes to ensure social distancing in place. Individual becomes unwell	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Staff Visitors to your premises Cleaners Contractors Drivers Vulnerable groups – Elderly, Pregnant workers, those with existing underlying health conditions Anyone else who physically comes in contact with you in relation to your business 	H	<p>If anyone becomes unwell with a new continuous cough or a high temperature in the workplace they will be sent home and advised to follow the stay at home guidance.</p> <p>If advised that a member of staff or public has developed Covid-19 and were recently on our premises (including where a member of staff has visited other work place premises such as domestic premises), the management team of the workplace will contact the Public Health Authority to discuss the case, identify people who have been in contact with them and will take advice on any conditions or precautions that should be taken.</p> <p>RIDDOR reporting should be completed if, one or more of the following conditions are met:</p> <p>An unintended incident at work has led to someone's possible or actual exposure to coronavirus. This must be reported as a dangerous occurrence.</p> <p>If an employee has been diagnosed as having COVID 19 and there is reasonable evidence that it was caused by exposure at work this must be reported as a case of disease.</p>	M	<p>HSE COVID RIDDOR GUIDANCE: https://www.hse.gov.uk/news/riddor-reporting-coronavirus.htm</p>	Line managers will maintain regular contact with staff members during this time.
PPE	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Staff Visitors to your premises Cleaners Contractors Drivers Vulnerable groups – Elderly, Pregnant workers, those with existing underlying health conditions Anyone else who physically comes in contact with you in relation to your business 	H	<p>Most young people and workers (since 24 September 2020) aged 11 years and over (from the day of their 11th birthday) are advised to wear a face covering indoors, including within youth centres.</p> <p>Staff to wear face coverings indoors if a school is visiting.</p> <p>Where respiratory protective equipment (RPE) is a requirement for risks associated with the work undertaken the following measures will be followed:</p> <p>Tight-fitting respirators (such as disposable FFP3 masks and reusable half masks) rely on having a good seal with the wearer's face. Create one way system in all communal areas. Regular disinfection of objects and handles that are touched regularly. Deep clean of all areas weekly. Deep clean of rental units immediately after check out. Limit numbers of persons taking part in activity group. Reducing meal offers to just breakfast. Ensuring a regular supply of crockery in the dining area. Disinfection of all crockery after use.</p>	M		Rigorous checks will be carried out by line managers to ensure that the necessary procedures are being followed. Staff to be reminded on a daily basis of the importance of social distancing both in the workplace and outside of it.
