<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Slippery surfaces: - slide and grass</li> <li>• Soap - allergies</li> <li>• Stones and sticks</li> <li>• Strong sun – dehydration, sun burn</li> <li>• Slipping / tripping / falling over</li> <li>• Hazard increased by poor behaviour / poor supervision</li> <li>• Bruising/head injury from slipping over backwards</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Staff</li> <li>• County / area officers</li> <li>• Children using the slide</li> <li>• Teachers</li> <li>• Braeside staff</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Cover anchor pegs with cones</li> <li>• Clear instructions of use</li> <li>• Controlled sliding – maximum of 1 at a time – no running onto slide and headfirst slide only</li> <li>• Regulate amount of soap used – not too much</li> <li>• No standing up on slide</li> <li>• Adult controlling children’s “turn” at top of slide</li> <li>• Next child not to start until slide is empty</li> <li>• First aid kit available</li> <li>• Children to get showered and changed immediately after activity.</li> <li>• Only use safe soap / shower gel, not industrial detergents, and consider any skin conditions.</li> <li>• Children observing to sit well back form slide.</li> </ul>
