Wear gloves and use a shovel or sprinkle method. Salt/grit applied to areas where high people traffic is likely including car park walkways, site paths and slopes to reduce risk. Applied in evening before cold conditions or early morning. Surface cleared of snow and thick ice before salt/grit applied to reduce slip risk. Advise staff to not work alone and tell someone if they are working alone. Location of other adults and first aid kit is known. Visiting staff to be briefed to supervise group, warn of slip risk areas and any specific students who require specific attention. Regular check of condition of equipment and ball court before students use this area. Warning of patio edge/steps and to not run around patio area All groups briefed as needed by centre staff 	<p>Ensure salt/grit is checked and topped up if necessary before the winter period.</p>
