Access to cleaning products		 Cleaning products to be kept in locked areas, unless in staff only areas.

Falls from windows		High floor windows to have restriction bars. All windows to be secured open / closed to prevent trapped fingers etc.	
Allergies to food		Individuals should inform Braeside staff in advance of visit, of any allergies or special dietary requirements.
