Helmets to be worn by under 18's. Qualified instructor or teacher (min. BC UKCC Level 1/ CB PSI). Instructors to ensure buoyancy aids are appropriate size, worn correctly and checked for condition. Instructors to check boats and personal equipment including footwear. Instructors to check if paddlers have long laces on trainers, excess webbing on buoyancy aids, unfastened clothing, long hair tied back, to avoid snagging on boats. Instructors able to rescue a capsized paddler trapped in their boat. Boats are to be fitted with sufficient buoyancy to float when capsized. Instructors to be trained in emptying boats and rescue techniques. Instructors to check appropriate craft used for paddler ability and water conditions. Instructors to carry safety equipment reflecting the conditions and group ability. Instructors and activity leaders may prevent anyone from paddling that they believe is unfit to do so or lacking sufficient experience or skill to manage the conditions. 			Low

All paddlers to be made aware that river/canal environments carry a risk of waterborne disease or infection (e.g. Weil's Disease or EColi). All teachers/responsible adults to be directed to read information notice on Leptospirosis (Weil's disease). Change of clothes, towel etc. Instructions on not drinking the water. 	Low
